The Ongoing Discourse on the CAP

- Criticism of the distribution of direct payments
- Criticism of complexity and lacking effectiveness of "greening"

- Need for increasing resilience of farms
- Need for enabling conditions for young farmers
- Improvement of basic infrastructure (including broadband)
- Need for taking into account structural diversity
- More attention to societal expectations (habitat, landscape amenities)
- Need for climate action (mitigation and adaptation)
- Improved resource management (soil, water, genetic resources)
- Complexity of administration and control
- Requirement of result-based assurance
- Need for coalitions for agriculture and rural areas (Cork)


